

rom Sospel to Barcelonnette, you have
a choice of six valleys in two departments:
Vésubie, Tinée, Roya-Bévéra, the valleys
of High-Var/Cians (in Alpes Maritimes), High-Verdon
and Ubaye (Alpes de Hautes Provence).
The panoramic views of lakes and peaks, gorges
are simply breathtaking! Give yourself several days
to do justice to all the beauty.

A few sites not to miss during your stay in the Mercantour mountain range:

La Vallée des Merveilles: an unmissable site in the Roya valley, dotted with glacial lakes and dominated by Mount Bego. This is an open-air Bronze Age sanctuary, decorated with some 36,000 prehistoric petroglyphs!

La Colmiane: a ski resort located at an altitude of 1500 m which offers many outdoor activities in summer and boasts the longest zip line in France!

Berthemont-les-Bains: la station thermale, au cœur de la Vallée de la Vésubie à une heure de Nice, est l'unique de la Côte d'Azur!

The Authion mountain range is a true natural fortress culminating at an altitude of more than 2000m and offering grandiose panoramic views from the Mediterranean to the Alps.





Also worth a visit: Gélas peak, the highest point in the Mercantour (3,143 m), the Col de Tende, the Gorges de Daluis, the remarkable Ratery forest, the Col de la Bonette, the highest european road, for grandiose panoramic views...

Exceptional fauna and flora

You may be lucky enough to come across an Alpine ibex, a chamois, a golden eagle or a grey wolf...

The Mercantour Park is home to a huge diversity of animal species (nearly 9,000) whose populations are constantly increasing.

It is also a paradise for flowers with more than 2000 identified plant species, i.e. more than half of the flora of the PACA region!

The glacial lakes of Vens are strung out high up in a rocky landscape hemmed in with lush vegetation and exuberant flowers.

Their clear waters reflect the peaks and feed a series of dizzying waterfalls.

The village of Péone sits proudly amid the rocky landscape. The village's impressive architecture is accentuated by the 'Demoiselles' (dolomite 'needles') which overlook it.

The Col de la Cayolle along the 'Route des Grandes Alpes' is the perfect starting point for hikers and cyclists.

The unique location of the Park between the Alps and the Mediterranean lets species flourish year-round.

Parc naturel régional des Préalpes d'Azur (*Préalpes* Regional Nature Reserve), the 'water tower' of the Côte d'Azur

WELCOME TO THE PARC DES PRÉALPES D'AZUR,

AN AREA OF NATURE AND CULTURE WHERE LIFE IS GOOD...

erfectly situated in the Préalpes (foothills) around Grasse, between the valleys of the Siagne, Loup, Cagne, Estéron and Var, this nature reserve has been dubbed the 'water tower' of the Côte d'Azur. Did you know that thanks to its underground water reserves, it supplies drinking water to many towns in the south of the region?

Underground journey

Water is the master-builder here. By seeping through the mountains, it creates remarkable underground landscapes that you can admire by descending in the souterroscope of the Baume Obscure cave in Saint-Vallier-de-Thiey or in the cave of Saint-Cézaire-sur-Siagne.

These underground expeditions among the stalagmites and stalactites, will stay with you for a long time.

Between coast and mountain

Between Carros and Saint-Cézaire-sur-Siagne, passing through Grasse and as far north as La Penne, this intact rural mountain area overlooks the coast. You can walk between rocky landscapes and arid moors (Calern, Caussols, Saint-Barnabé plateaux), criss-cross valleys and their charming villages (Saint-Auban, Aiglun, Sigale, Les Mujouls), drink refreshing water in the steep gorges (Loup and Siagne gorges), explore forests (Sauma Longa wood, Cheiron wood) and farmed or grazed plains (Caille plain).

In addition, if you love mountain walking, the peak of Cheiron at 1,778 metres is waiting for you. Your reward? Views of an infinite landscape stretching over the whole department and even to Corsica in good weather!

An exceptional biodiversity

The Orsini's viper and the white-clawed crayfish, both rare in France, thrive in the Préalpes d'Azur.

Here, the Mediterranean species coexist with more mountainous or even alpine species, such as the Southern festoon and Apollo butterflies. Wonderful!

A third of mainland France's flora is found here, i.e. more than 2,000 plant species, some of which are unique in the world: Erodium rodiei (a type of geranium), Campanula albicans (a type of bell flower) and the French snowflake.

Caves and sinkholes are the perfect refuge habitats for many animals such as cave bats.




The wild lands of the Monts d'Azur Nature Reserve

Located one hour from Nice and 40 minutes from Grasse, the village of Thorenc is the home to the Monts d'Azur Nature Reserve. An exceptional example of 'rewilding.' A mix of rocky cliffs, vast meadows and remarkable woodlands, here, Nature plunges you into a world where astonishing prehistoric species of European fauna, such as bison, Prjevalski horses, elks and fallow deer roam wild!!

The stunningly red Estérel mountain range

MAJESTICALLY NESTLED BETWEEN THE MEDITERRANEAN AND THE DEPARTMENTS

he surprising and very characteristic, red rocks (from lava that emerged from the earth 250 million years ago) are sculpted into steep cliffs which give the landscape an exhilarating charm that will not leave you indifferent...

Over the 32,000 hectares of wild landscape (half of which is classified as a Natura 2000 zone), ramblers, horse riders, mountain bikers have the time of their lives taking the various trails.

These include:
Pic de l'Ours, Saint-Barthélémy
rock, Cap Dramont, Cap Roux lookout point,
Mont-Vinaigre, Perthus and Malinfernet ravines,
Blavet Gorges...

The Corniche d'Or (Golden coastal) road... Just like in Colorado!

For 30 km, from Cannes to Saint-Raphaël, the Corniche d'Or, or the Estérel coastal road,

is a superb road bordered by the turquoise waters of the Mediterranean and the red rocks of the Estérel. This is magical place overlooking rocky inlets and magnificent landscapes where you can stop to admire the panoramic views or swim in the coves!

An underwater discovery trail and beautiful spots await you at the Parc naturel départemental de la Pointe de l'Aiguille in Théoulesur-Mer, as well as secret coves at Le Trayas... A total change of scenery that makes you feel like you are in the Grand Canyon yet, you are just a few minutes from the red carpet (of the Cannes Film Festival) on the Croisette.






One, two, three... cornices, let's take to the heights.

AFTER DRIVING ALONG THE SUBLIME CORNICHE D'OR, THE ROCKY COASTAL ROAD LINKING CANNES TO SAINT-RAPHAËL IN THE WEST OF THE DEPARTMENT,

HEAD EAST, FROM NICE TO MENTON TO DISCOVER THREE OTHER COASTAL ROADS.



hether you take the low (100 m), middle (300 m) or high (500 m) road, lthe trio offers breathtaking views with sky and sea as background...

La Basse Corniche (low coastal road) is closest to the coast and urban areas. This takes you through Villefranche-sur-Mer, Beaulieu-sur-Mer, Eze, Capd'Ail, Monaco Monte-Carlo, Roquebrune-Cap-Martin et Menton. It also leads to the famous Cap Ferrat and Cap Martin.

La Moyenne Corniche, (Middle coastal road), the old N7 (the holiday road from Paris to the coast), has kept its four lanes and takes you into Monaco from above, an ideal way to visit its exotic garden.



It offers magnificent views of Nice, **Cap Ferrat**, **Monaco** and goes through the superb hilltop village of **Èze**. The highest point of this coastal road is at 300 m just after Èze... A must-see.

Finally, *Ia Haute Corniche* avoids all the villages between **Nice** and **La Turbie**, instead, it gives you sumptuous views of Nice, Cap Ferrat and Cap Martin.

It leads to the Nice Observatory, the old village of Roquebrune and its medieval castle as well as La Turbie with its **Roman Trophy dedicated to the Emperor Augustus**.

This village, a legendary spot on the Paris-Nice bicycle race sitting at an altitude of 500 m after the famous Col d'Èze, is full of surprises. If it's spectacular views you are after, **the Fort de la Revère** at an altitude of 700 m offers exceptional 360° panoramic views. Here, **the Astrorama** organises astronomy-related events.

The wonderful marine world of **Pelagos Sanctuary**

IMAGINE A MARINE RESERVE OF 87,500 km2 IN THE MEDITERRANEAN WHERE MARINE MAMMALS REIGN SUPREME...

ocated between France (Hyères), Monaco and the Italian coast (extending as far as Rome), the Pelagos sanctuary was created under an agreement between Italy, the Principality of Monaco and France to protect the marine mammals living

This vast ecosystem is of huge scientific, socio-economic, cultural and educational interest.

Despite the good ecological conditions of the basin, it is under pressure from natural fluctuations in the environment and the impact of human activity (pollution, noise, fast motor boats, accidental capture, disturbance from tourists, etc.). Concrete measures have been put in place to protect the areas, notably with the charity, SOS Grand Bleu.

The Lerins Islands: beauty, history and spirituality

Fifteen minutes by boat from Cannes, the Lérins archipelago includes two jewels: the islands of Sainte-Marguerite and Saint-Honorat.

A magical setting where nature reigns.

Mysteries and historical discoveries await you at the Fort Royal, while on Sainte-Marguerite you can explore eucalyptus trees, a bird sanctuary, the Musée de la Mer (Sea Museum) and unspoilt coves.



Spirituality is the focus on Saint-Honorat. Since the 16th century, this timeless and silent island has been home to Cistercian monks who live in harmony with nature and their prayers. Guided tours are offered as well as the opportunity to taste the famous wines produced by the Abbey's monks. A sinful indulgence!

Waterfalls, rivers, basins...

• La clue d'Aiglun, carved by the Estéron, is one of the most famous canyons in Europe. You can swim at the base of the waterfalls and sunbathe on the beautiful polishedstone beaches.



- Les Gours du Ray ooffers a bucolic setting where you can swim in mint-coloured water and a enjoy the pebble beach.
 3 km after Gréolières, on the road to Andon on the D79.
- Le Pont des Tamarins and its large shady picnic area on the banks of the Brague is the ideal spot to spend a day with the family and play pétanque. In Biot, continue on the road to Valbonne (D4) then take the Avenue des Fauvettes.
- And also... le pont du Cros and its fine sandy beach: from Plan-du-Var towards the Vésubie valley (M2565), or the Gordolasque torrent, a pan at an altitude of 1,600 metres, on the edge of the Mercantour National Park...

Winter sun on the Route du Mimosa...

From January to March, between Bormes-les-Mimosas and Grasse, you can enjoy a truly fragrant journey along the Mimosa Road! This 130 km tourist road is a symbol of the Côte d'Azur in winter, with its azure blue skies and sunny yellow flowers. It will delight your eyes and warm your heart! Highlights include the Marande garden in Mandelieu-La Napoule, the 'massif du Tanneron' (the largest mimosa forest in Europe) and the waterfront in Pégomas, Let's go! Choose from marked trails, supervised Nordic walking classes, 83.7 km of cycling routes, not forgetting the Corniche d'or or St Cassien and Tanneron lakes. www.routedumimosa.com



A protected Dark Sky



After obtaining the international Dark-sky preserve' certification (DSP) in 2019, the region of Alpes Azur Mercantour became a member of the very closed club of astronomical observatories and national and departmental nature reserves which protect their sky. The first reserve to receive this certification

in the south-east, 3rd in France and the 14th DSP in the world, it extends over the areas of the Parc régional des Préalpes d'Azur, the Communauté de Communes Alpes d'Azur, a part of the Mercantour National Park, and the mountains above Grasse as far as Ubaye. Make sure you look up to the sky!


Gorges of Cians and Daluis: Nice's Colorado

The road to Valberg from the coast is worth the side trip alone...

Whether you choose to go through the Gorges of Cians or Daluis, you will be amazed and totally disoriented by these unique geological sites dubbed Nice's Colorado.

This tour can be done by bike or even on foot in some sections of the old road or by following hiking trails.

Here, you will discover the red pelite walls of the Cians gorges, the Petite and Grande Clue, the Amen waterfalls, the legend of the Bride's Bridge and the 'Woman's Head', the guardian of Daluis gorge.



NEW 2021: come and discover the fully new 'Geologist treks'!

In spring and autumn, **the Geologist treks** bring you on a journey through time and space around the geological secrets of the Gorges of Daluis!

The Gorges of Daluis Regional Nature Reserve is the only reserve of the Alpes-Maritimes, created in 2012 thanks to an original partnership between the Alpes d'Azur municipalities and the LPO PACA (Birds Protection League).


Fauna and flora at the Phoenix Park in Nice



- Broc Lake Nature Reserve is a drop of turquoise at the confluence of the Estéron and the Var rivers. 20 km from Nice, it is a beautiful walk for the whole family with a fun, sports trail, a bird observatory and panoramic views of the lake, the mountains and the hilltop village of La Roquette-sur-Var!
- Le Parc de l'Estéron, named after the eponymous river running through the villages of Roquestéron and La Roque-en-Provence, has a rich architectural heritage. Dominated by the Chapelle Sainte-Pétronille, an exceptional flora and fauna flourish here between the limestone hillsides, the alluvial forest and the river.
- In the **Pointe de l'Aiguille Nature Reserve,** in Théoule-sur-Mer, you can swim in the clear waters of wild inlets under the glow of the famous red volcanic rocks... Truly magical!
- Le Parc des Rives du Loup, ebetween the plain and the canyon, this reserve spans the municipalities of Cagnes-sur-Mer, Villeneuve-Loubet and La Colle-sur-Loup. Mallards, badgers, wild boars,

- weasels, foxes and rodents make their home here among the ash trees, bay trees and field elms.
- Le Parc des Rives du Var, close to the coast, is particularly original because of its 20-kilometrelong walk along both riverbanks, accessible by a cycle track. It is listed as a Natura 2000 site of the lower Var Valley.
- Le Parc de Vaugrenier, located in Villeneuve-Loubet, hides the last natural freshwater coastal lake in the Alpes-Maritimes!

The « Parc de Vaugrenier » is the first one to be experienced with this new app and will be followed in 2022 by seven other departmental nature reserves.

WITH VIEWS...

- Le Parc du Cros de Casté is a military fortification of the Maginot Line in Roquebrune-Cap-Martin. At the top of the site, you will enjoy exceptional panoramic views from the Italian border to Cap Martin and a remarkable historical heritage brought to life by a discovery trail...
- Le Parc de la Grande Corniche is located between La Trinité, Villefranche-sur-Mer, Èze and La Turbie. Here, you will enjoy breathtaking views over the coastline and even as far as Corsica. Thanks to its exceptional biodiversity, it is listed as a Natura 2000 site of the Corniches de la Rivera. Follow the signs!

 We recommend the Justice, Revère and Forna walks as well as a visit to the Maison de la Nature (Nature Centre) *!
- La Maison de la Nature : welcome to the visitor centre, la Masion de la Nature! Come and discover the history of the site, located in the Parc de la Grande Corniche, including its characteristic Mediterranean flora and fauna, its climate, its different phenomena and unique relief. Sustainable development, ecology and nature are also showcased in the temporary exhibition and video projection rooms.
- In Parc de Roquevignon, located 500 metres above Grasse, nature lovers will be charmed by the characteristic landscape of the foothills of the Mediterranean Alps where a large number of orchids have taken up residence.
- Le Parc du Vinaigrier on the edge of Nice, is a well-preserved former traditional farm with unique views of the Baie des Angels and Villefranche-sur-Mer harbour. Mont Vinaigrier, surrounded by olive trees, rises to 370 metres.
- Le Parc du San Peyre, sits atop a volcanic cone in Mandelieu-La Napoule also offers a magnificent 360° views of the Gulf of La Napoule, the valleys of Siagne and Argentière, and the majestic peaks of the Mercantour and the Estérel.
- Le Parc du Plan des Noves: this is a paradise for walkers, pastoralism and bee-keeping.
 The richness of the environments encountered and its biodiversity has resulted in it being listed in the Natura 2000 site of the Préalpes de Grasse.
 Get ready for majestic views from the sea to the Mercantour above Baous in Vence.

FAR FROM URBAN LIFE...

 Parc du Sinodon: set back in Roquefort-les-Pins, this forest area is graced with a hilly relief and gentle slopes making it very accessible. We love **its tracks and paths**, they are wonderful for walking and discovering the natural environment!

- Parc de la Valmasque: with three wooded hills stretching between the Brague, Valmasque and Bouillide rivers, this nature reserve, ideal for children and welcomes you for nature walks, games or jogging circuits. We love the lotus flowers in the Font Merle pond with its birds, carp and ducks...
- Le Parc de l'Estérel performs a symphony of colours between the red rocks and the azure blue between Mandelieu-La Napoule and Théoule-sur-Mer. The majesty, beauty and calm will impress you...


- Admire a thousand-year-old olive tree, in the Parc d'Estienne d'Orves, an island of greenery in the heart of Nice where you can follow the heritage discovery trail to explore the site's riches.
- Visit one of the last remaining coastal forest areas of the Côte d'Azur at the Parc du Paradou, in Vallauris, where eucalyptus and mimosas trees reign!
- Go mountain biking or hiking with breathtaking panoramic views in the Parc de l'Ubac Foran near Menton and Monaco. The paths and forest tracks hug the Alpine slopes and tower over the Carei valley and the coastline.



Grande Traversée du Mercantour (GR®GTM): From the high mountains to the sea!

This exceptional itinerary of almost 220 kilometres begins in the upper Var valley, crosses the Tinée and Vésubie valleys, and then descends from the Merveilles mountain refuge to Menton...

Eight routes will take you through the hill country of Alpes-Maritimes and four of them will take you through the centre of the Parc naturel régional des Préalpes d'Azur.

These 'discovery' routes lead you into magnificent regions where gastronomy, geology and history are on the agenda.

Ready, steady, go!...

Reserved for the more energetic among you, the 'Boucles sportives' cross the wild territories of the Var Valley in the highlands, from the Mediterranean to the legendary Turini pass in the east and across the Vence pass in the west. You can also explore the unspoilt countryside of the Parc naturel régional des Préalpes d'Azur and the Siagne Valley from Mandelieu-La Napoule.

Cycling with the family

Over short distances and low gradients, these routes take you into the rarely visited mountain and hill regions in Alpes-Maritimes. If you want to mix discovery with relaxation, choose a road bike, a mountain bike or hybrid bike depending on the route.

Bike touring

It is also possible to head off for several days alone, with friends or family in the department's two large protected nature reserves.

With Le Grand Tour des Préalpes d'Azur on bike from Grasse you will discover the different landscapes of the nature reserve: cluses, high limestone plateaus, hilltop villages, overlooking the Mediterranean.

This tour of the Mercantour challenges you to ride over the legendary routes of the great Tour de France champions!

A mountaineering challenge for cyclists to conquer the high passes in the Mercantour, reserved for experienced cyclists.

The tour, has 5 stages – and in as many days, crosses a good part of the Southern Alps with its vertiginous landscapes.

In all: 360 km with almost 10,000 m of ascent!

On the bike routes...

EuroVelo 8, the 'Mediterranean by bike'

crosses the Alpes-Maritimes department and the Côte d'Azur to Italy. This is an opportunity to explore magnificent landscapes from the Fayence region and its hilltop villages before heading to the Mediterranean along the banks of the Siagne, the coastline and climbing from Nice to the Col de Tende.



TAKING TOURIST TRAINS ALONG HISTORICAL ROUTES IS ALSO ENVIRONMENTALLY FRIENDLY AND FUN!

In the hills of Menton, Sainte-Agnès, the highest coastal village in Europe, is an ideal place for horseback riding. From the tracks around the village to the medium-altitude-mountain paths, you will marvel at the exceptional beauty of the landscape and the gentleness of the horses from 'Horse and Ventures.'

You can also return to the 19th century and proudly follow the legendary Imperial Route Napoleon. On horseback, the route covers the Emperor's footsteps over 350 km between Grasse and Vizille (Grenoble).

In Alpes-Maritimes, the route covers over 40 km from Grasse to Peyroules. After starting with a sea view, you will then enter the medium-altitude mountains (covering 60% of the route) with altitudes ranging from 531 m to 1,228 m. www.route-napoleon-a-cheval.fr

Or by steam train...

The train is leaving now for an unforgettable journey back in time to conquer magnificent landscapes. The hundred-year-old 'pignes' steam **train** gentle rocks us at the pace of the last century from Nice to the department of Haute Provence, from the olive country to chestnut land.

You can stop off in the medieval villages of Entrevaux and Annot, the region of Grès and up to the region of Fugeret, at an altitude of more than 800 m!

One train can hide another...

Le Train des Merveilles us on the royal road of Baroque, the historical route of the salt trade, from the Mediterranean coast to the Alps.

This tour, far from the crowds, promises to be a panoramic drive in the mountains, through the medieval villages of Sospel with its Saint-Michel cathedral, a hidden treasure from the 17th century; Saorge: one of the most beautiful villages in France with its Monastery; Breil-sur-Roya and its surprising transport ecomuseum. Tende also has some nice surprises in store for you: the Musée des Merveilles, the Mercantour visitor centre and the Maison du miel et des Abeilles (Bee & Honey Centre), as well as the wonderful chapel of Notre-Damedes Fontaines de la Brigue.

At Breil-sur-Roya, you can choose to go down into the Italian Piedmont, to Ventimille. Without a doubt, this is one of the most beautiful train journeys in Europe! For the more curious, note that a tour guide will be in the front carriage of the train during the summer season.

Into the water!

Jumping, abseiling and tobogganing, canyoning provides plenty of thrills in an exceptional environment, amidst emerald-coloured basins, waterfalls and wild nature.

With more than 280 canyoning sites listed, the Côte d'Azur is a hot spot for this sport. Canyoning, rafting and kayak-rafting await you amid lush mountain greenery...

Vertigo

If scaling the heights is your thing, test out the Via Ferrata! 'The Balma Negra' of Roubion is one of the shortest routes on the Côte d'Azur, perfect for an introduction to the activity. In 90 minutes, this 300-metre route takes you across a cliff face up to an altitude of 1,500 metres, with views overlooking the entire Tinée valley. For the experienced, the longer 'Baus de la Frema' route to La Colmiane takes five hours along 1,600 metres of cable! Speaking of cables and Colmiane, don't forget to test out the largest zipline in France, whilst you are here! The surprising and unique Via Ferrata of Lantosque

overlooks the Vésubie river.

Underground

If you are looking for a way to cool down and if the underground world enchants you, go to the Parc de la Moulière in Caille for a Via Souterrata, a mix between via ferrata and speleology! At a depth of 45 metres, you will discover stalactites and stalagmites along rope bridges, footbridges or by abseiling... A fabulous experience and very rare in France.

Vesúbia Mountain Park is full of adventures!

In the Vésubie valley, the Vesúbia Mountain Park is the place to go if you want to swim, climb, jump, scale the summits, try your hand at canyoning, work on your balance, walk underground, play sports, relax, play, and do all kinds of fun indoor and outdoor mountain activities.



Nature experiences at sea or in the air on the coast

SNORKELLING, DIVING, PADDLING, PARAGLIDING...
ENJOY THE THRILL OF NATURE, WITHOUT AN ENGINE, ON THE CÔTE D'AZUR!

Paddle boarding...

Stand Up Paddle boarding (SUP) is a very popular activity, and the perfect sustainable way to relax on the sea. With its calm sea, its little secret coves and islands, the Côte d'Azur is perfect setting for this activity.

Here are some of the best spots we recommend:

- The Iles de Lérins off the coast of Cannes, has coves with turquoise water;
- In la Siagne, starting from Robinson beach in Mandelieu-La Napoule, enjoy the calm water, amidst ducks, swans and geese;
- Cap d'Antibes and the Baie des Milliardaires from the Port de L'Olivette: here you can paddle along intact coves and incredible beach for swimming breaks far from the crowds, and also in Menton, there is a great spot opposite the old town with its colourful façades.



Are you a speed junky? **Test out electric surfboard** which can reach speeds of 35 km/h.

Even more sensational, the eFoil lets you fly above the water up to 30 km/h, emitting no noise or pollution

There is no shortage of kite-surfing and sailing spots on the Côte d'Azur, where you can also rent a sea kayak.

Scuba diving

The Big Blue is always a paradise for experienced or novice divers. **A plane wreck** awaits you in front of the beautiful bay of Villefranche-sur-Mer. Between Nice and Villefranche-sur-Mer, the most experienced among you can admire the 3 Islets and the red underwater rocks at a depth of 35 metres.

The Pointe de Saint-Hospice at Cap Ferrat and the 'Tombant du Cap Gros' (a reef drop off) at Cap d'Antibes are home to an incredible underwater fauna, as is the Estérel Théoule Maritime Park, which you can reach by diving at the Port de la Rague in Mandelieu-La Napoule.


Snorkeling

Among the remarkable and unmissable snorkelling siltes, is the undersea discovery trail of the Pointe de l'Aiguille.

This is something anyone can do, and will let you observe, recognise and become aware of the fauna and flora of the Mediterranean shallows.









Another rare sight is the first ecomuseum of France and the Mediterranean to be inaugurated in Cannes in 2021, which you visit with your flippers on! Wearing you mask and snorkel, follow the trail some hundred metres from the south coast of the southern shore of Sainte-Marguerite Island and discover six monumental statues by the artist Jason deCaires sitting at least five metres depth.

This dreamlike work is also environmentally friendly as it serves as a refuge for underwater life.

Paragliding

Because the Côte d'Azur is also sublime seen from above, why not fly over the coast like a bird, in a paraglider?

It is incredibly thrilling and there are plenty of magical views guaranteed between the sea and the mountains, whether you choose to leave from Roquebrune-Cap-Martin, Grasse or Gourdon...

Underground in caves

hat if one of the region's most precious treasures were waiting for you underground? Water has in fact carved out many caves in the heart of the limestone mountains.

- The Souterroscope of the Grotte de Baume Obscure in Saint-Vallier-de-Thiey offers visitors an astonishing spectacle along a specially designed underground path. Treasure hunts, paleo-digs and sky-watching are also available.
- The Domaine de la Grotte de Saint-Cézaire réserve aussi bien des surprises dans son parc also has many surprises in its six-hectare wooded estate 20 minutes from Grasse: a visit to the cave, a 'mini-hike' to discover the Mediterranean flora, a tree-top adventure trail with more than 50 workshops, and much more...!



In the air in the trees

• Le Bois des Lutins, Canyon Forest, Pitchoun Forest in Villeneuve-Loubet, Riviera Nature Adventure Trail in Grasse, Parcabout in Montauroux, Colmiane Forest in La Colmiane, you are spoilt for choice if you are an avid tree climber! Footbridges, zip lines, rope bridges and creepers await your entire herd in the adventure parks and tree-top adventure trails of the Côte d'Azur! For the more courageous among you, Peira Cava Adventure in Lucéram offers you a thrilling ride with the highest zip lines in the region, suspended almost 200 m from the ground. A unique experience!



With animals

 An oasis of greenery, education, awareness and relaxation!
- Another idea for a trip is the Monts d'Azur Reserve for horse-drawn carriage or walking safaris among the bison and Przewalski horses (more information on page 12).

In the Kingdom of Flowers...

Between Grasse, the world perfume capital and Mandelieu-La Napoule, the Mimosa capital, the Côte d'Azur is truly a land of flowers and perfumes!

Did you know that Grasse has had a special relationship with **Rosa Centifolia**, the most heady of roses, for centuries?

ExpoRose has been the largest cut rose exhibition in Europe since 1970. In mid-May, the town, its gardens and fountains are adorned with pink and activities include a scent trail, culinary workshops, competitions and a market.

Did you know?

Grandiflorum Jasmine, grown in Grasse since the middle of the 19th century, gives off an unforgettable, sweet, floral and fruity fragrance.

Its flowers are collected from August to September.

he olive tree is the true symbol of Mediterranean... The Alpes-Maritimes department has about thirty olive mills and olive-growing cooperatives, from Menton to Grasse.



Among them, the Huilerie Saint-Michel * founded in 1896 in Menton, has handed down its know-how and exacting standards to get the very best from its olive oil. Some of its innovative products, include oil with lemons from Menton created especially with the Côte d'Azur chef with three Michelin stars, Mauro Colagreco!

Another exceptional oil mill established in 1868, the Maison Alziari * in Nice perpetuates its ancestral expertise for producing great olive oil vintages.



Did you know that small producers who only have a few trees also bring their olive harvest to be pressed at the mill or the cooperative?

On the Côte d'Azur Wine Route!

Thanks to its favourable climate and soil. the Côte d'Azur is also full of wineries.

In Villars-sur-Var, the Clos Saint-Joseph is the only winery in the department to sell wines under the famous Côtes-de-Provence appellation.

Although they do not have an AOP, the wines produced by the monks of Lérins, on the island of Saint-Honorat, are also worth tasting.



This wine can also be found in the restaurants of Michelin-star chefs in the region. Also unusual is the **AOC Bellet**, one of the oldest appellations in France, created in 1941.

This authentic Nice vineyard, on the hill of Saint-Roman de Bellet, is celebrating its 80th anniversary this year! Château de Bellet, Crémat and the very small vineyard producing organic wines,

Domaine de la Source, are some of the 9 estates in the appellation!



Beers made in Côte d'Azur

The Nordic countries are not the only place where

beer is a star. It is also cherished here by local brewers who are getting known for their innovative methods, excellent quality and the freshness of their foam!

In Nice, you can try the chickpea beers at the Brasserie Artisanale, **Socca Biera**.

In Antibes, Solène teaches you how to brew your own beer at the **B06** and in Tourrettes-sur-Loup, Robin opens the doors of his **Bacho** workshops on the banks of the Loup.

Unmissable in the region, make sure you taste the beer from **Brasserie du Comté** *, and its beer brewed with Mercantour spring water!







Bzzzzz...!

Across the fields and scrubland, the bees are queens and the beekeepers harvest their many different types of honey. Lavender honey is the best known. It is pale and has a tangy taste.

In La Colle-sur-Loup, passionate beekeepers Olivier and Xavier Valette have created **Le Petit Caiolais** and **L'Abeille Savonneuse**.

For their honey production, they favour wild corners of paradise in the hills behind Nice: Col de Vence, Escragnolles, the Grès d'Annot are sites of remarkable biodiversity, which produce an exceptional local honey.

In Belvedere, the bees of François and Patricia Guerinot at **La Miellerie** roam freely from their 200 or so hives! These pampered bees produce exquisite honey and high-quality by-products (soaps, candles, gingerbread, nougat, lollies, etc.).

Holy cow!

The many mountain areas are dotted with barns and 'vacheries' such as **Les Cabanes Vieilles** in Moulinet, in the Authion mountain range, where you can taste tomme and milk from the cows that roam the mountain pastures.

In the Mercantour, at the **Vacherie de Chastillon** d'Isola 2000, you will learn all the secrets of milking! Not far from there, at the **Fromagerie de la Chèvre Blanche de Bouyon**, you will be welcomed to the farm where you can learn all about farming.

With both Organic and PGI certification **La Maison du Citron** opens the doors of its farm to you thanks to the *Bienvenue* à *Ia Ferme* network.

Also, a young man in his thirties, Adrien Gannac, is a citrus fruit producer and in particular a producer of Menton lemons.

He also organises open days and guided tours of his farm. He also produces jams, confectionery, olives and flavoured terrines, as well as liqueurs, beers and aperitifs with tangy flavours.




Sweet and flowery treats

The chestnut, which grows locally in Isola, once made the village wealthy, and is now used in a whole range of products.

Le canal de la Châtaigneraie (Chestnut canal) is a wonderful walk to do in Isola.

The much rarer saffron is also grown in the Alpes-Maritimes!

Still in Isola, at 'Chez Céline et Sébastien,' you can explore a saffron farm in the heart of the Mercantour National Park; Unless you prefer to go to 'le Jas des Rochers' of Claude and Emmanuelle and their farm located at an altitude of 1,000 metres in Cipières, in mountains above Grasse.

The certification label is divided into two categories: twenty or so Restaurants and ten or so "Merenda e Goustaroun", which showcase excellent snack bars and takeaways.



Below the town of Biot, there is a treasure trove: the oldest factory, which in 1956 brilliantly transformed a recurring defect in the production of glass objects.


The tiny bubbles embedded in the centre of pieces became a fashionable effect and above all a trademark. From then on, Biot's glass craftsmen developed an international reputation.

The Verrerie de Biot * welcomes visitors for an unparalleled journey into the world of glass blowing. This method of using bubbled glass comes into its own here in prestigious, historical, but also contemporary collections such as those designed by Anne Lechaczynski, the energetic CEO; they adorn the tables with plates, glasses, vases, candle holders, pots and bowls magnified by a thousand reflections of light

A visit to **the Atelier Pierini** *, located in a 15th century building, is a must.
Following in the footsteps of his father, Robert, a true glass designer, Antoine Pierini, the current master glassmaker, designs pieces in blown glass and others worked according to traditional methods. You will find stunning collections exhibited and for sale in this centre dedicated to knowledge sharing.

A place of grace!





Vallauris has the distinction of been awarded the 'Ville et Métiers d'Art' (Arts and Crafts town) certification label. Here, ceramists, potters and craftsmen perpetuate the passion and know-how that originated with their distant ancestors of the Gallo-Roman period, who were already skilfully exploiting the natural resources of this generous region. In the wake of Picasso's stay in Vallauris, the town has workshops run by great families of potters who have handed down their know-how from generation to generation, and have now been joined by a new wave of young ceramists with innovative and ambitious projects.

As you wander along Avenue Clemenceau, you will be able to explore the sheer depth and breadth of these crafts, which are both preserved and protected, but also reinvented.

A few examples, include Jonathan Reynaud and his designs such as a construction game (www.jonathan-reynaud-design-ceramique.fr) and Justine Ribera (www.lespetitesporcelaines.com) and her collection of utilitarian and decorative objects with Mexican overtones.

At MSG Ceramics (www.msg-ceramique.com),

Maureen magnifies cast porcelain, stoneware, glazes and plate work for beautiful and inventive designs.

Finally, of course, large companies such as Lou Pignatier (www.loupignatier.com) are still the leading names in turning, firing and manufactured decorations.

Terres de Provence

The Terres de Provence rassociation brings together ceramists, potters and sculptors from Alpes Maritimes.

The true perfume of the Côte d'Azur

In Grasse, the perfumeries open their doors to the public and organise free guided tours so that visitors can discover the mysterious alchemy of perfume making, from the raw materials, distillation and enfleurage, to the perfumiers and their creations, ending with a visit to the shop.

Some of them even offer introductory courses in the art of perfumery that allow perfume lovers to create their own eau de toilette with the help of a 'Nose.'

Among the most renowned are **Galimard**, one of the first French perfume houses founded in 1747 (www.galimard.com), Molinard (www.molinard.com) and the house of **Fragonard *** (www.usines-parfum. fragonard.com) which have been reinventing the perfumes for decades.

Museums, workshops, laboratories, shops... the beautiful perfumeries of the Côte d'Azur are constantly reinventing themselves. In Mouans-Sartoux, **the Garden of the International Perfume Museum** is a natural setting that testifies to the smells, perfumes and fragrances that form the very essence of the Grasse region.

This former bastide of perfumiers spans over two hectares of crop fields. The traditional flowers of the perfume industry rub shoulders with landscaped areas offering visitors pleasant walks all year round.

HIKING, EXPLORING NATURE AND SPENDING NIGHTS IN MOUNTAIN HUTS OR REFUGES ARE SOME OF THE BEST WAYS TO ENJOY THE DIFFERENT VALLEYS. HERE ARE A FEW IDEAS.

Roya Valley

Refuge des Merveilles: located in the heart of the Mercantour National Park in Tende, this refuge which epitomises the 'national Park Spirit' sits on the shores of the upper Long Lake amid the prehistoric rock engravings of the Vallée des Merveilles and numerous lakes and peaks: Bego, Grand Capelet and Cime du Diable...

Refuge de la Valmasque: a little higher, but still in Tende, at 2,233 m, on the banks of Lac Vert, above the Valmasque valley, the refuge of the same name is very comfortable. Opening onto a beautiful wide terrace, it gives beautiful views over a world of rocky lakes and short grass.

Le Refuge de Fontanalbe is perfect for exploring the rock carvings archaeological site along the Voie Sacrée (Sacred Way). It is also close to the Lac Vert de Fontanalbe, the Lacs Jumeaux, the Vallaurette drop and the entire Fontanalbe valley. www.refugedefontanalbe.com

Vésubie Valley

Refuge de Nice: not far from there, in Belvédère, the Refuge de Nice, 'Esprit Parc National', is surrounded by the highest peaks and their eternal snow covering. It is a pleasant place to stop and observe the largest mammals of the Mercantour. Ibexes and chamois have taken up residence here. The panoramic terrace overlooks the beautiful Lac de la Fous. www.refugedenice.ffcam.fr

(Chalet) Refuge de la Madone de Fenestre:

This refuge is set in the heart of a majestic alpine amphitheatre dominated by the local giant, Gélas, the highest peak in Alpes-Maritimes (3,143 m). www.chaletmadonedefenestre.ffcam.fr

Refuge de la Cougourde: this refuge, which is certified under the trademark 'Esprit Parc National' is perched above the Haut Boréon valley, in Saint-Martin-Vésubie. It sits at the tree line

of the last larches and Swiss stone pines, in an exceptional environment, near a mountain

stream and a lake.

There are many stunning hikes to explore around this mountain hut: Caïre de Cougourde, Lake Trecolpas...

Tinée Valley

The Refuge de Rabuons, further to the north-west, at Saint-Étienne-de-Tinée, sits high up at 2,523 m and is located in the most alpine but least known site in Alpes-Maritimes. In the centre of a mineral landscape and on the edge of a large, deep mountain lake (100 m), this stone-walled refuge leads to breathtaking panoramic views!!

The Refuge des lacs de Vence, not far from there, is one of the most prestigious sites of the Mercantour Park, also rewarded with the 'Esprit Parc national' trademark. An environment of natural lakes, waterfalls in an ancient glacial cirque, a rich alpine meadow, a rich and varied fauna (mouflons, chamois, eagles, etc.). Take the opportunity to (re) discover the beautiful lakes of Vens and enjoy a local meal in this pleasant mountain refuge.

Refuge de Gialorgues: this traditional mountain hut in Saint-Delmas-le-Selvage is ideal for those who love peace and quiet. It enjoys a typical Mercantour alpine setting, above the Plan de la Sagne, and under the strange Fort Carra at 2,275 m. There are many hiking and mountaineering routes from this unstaffed chalet.







WHOSE AIM IS TO IMPLEMENT SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS.







o conserve the exceptional environment in the region, six major areas and 16 concrete projects are underway:

Eating better and supporting sustainable development in secondary schools: by tackling food waste, improving the food quality (50% certified products, 20% of which are organic), and raising awareness and educating people about sustainable development.

Reconnecting with nature and protecting natural areas: by acquiring and protecting natural areas to preserve biodiversity (> 100 ha as of 2020), by increasing the number of nature awareness events, and by developing a fun smartphone application to help people explore the Department's nature reserves.

Providing alternatives to the car: by developing the network of cycle paths and infrastructure to encourage soft mobility near schools, by increasing the number of carpooling sites, and by creating departmental coworking spaces.

Encouraging new, healthier practices:

by encouraging 'Zero pesticides,' and by supporting local, environmentally friendly farming.

Reducing energy expenditure: by providing financial support for thermal audits and renovation, by renovating the energy facilities in departmental buildings.

Promoting environmentally friendly methods:

by informing citizens and sharing positive projects, by integrating environmental criteria into departmental subsidies and public procurement contracts.

ith 'Cap 2030,' the Aéroports de la Côte d'Azur Group (which manages the Nice Côte d'Azur, Cannes Mandelieu and Golfe de Saint-Tropez airports) made a commitment in January 2020 to plant trees in the heart of the Côte d'Azur region and thus making it a carbon sink.

This is therefore the first time in France that a tripartite agreement has been signed between an airport operator, two municipalities (Saint-Césaire-sur-Siagne and Carros) and the National

Forestry Office. It commits Aéroports de la Côte d'Azur to finance the purchase of tree seedlings, to plant and maintain them over 30 years.

Thus, since December 2020, Aéroports de la Côte d'Azur has been financing the reforestation of 2.6 hectares in the municipality of Carros, where nearly 5 hectares of forest burned in July 2017.

This first stage represents a total of **2,080 trees**. **The Group will also reforest 0.5 hectares (500 cedars)** in Saint-Césaire-sur-Siagne, near Cannes-Mandelieu airport.

The group's reforestation statistics

€100,000 is the total budget per year as from 2021 (excluding maintenance costs, which are also borne by the airport management company);

80% of the communal forest areas in the Alpes-Maritimes region will be repopulated in 10 years; **300 tonnes of CO_2 equivalent** will be captured thanks to the number of trees planted by 2030.

'NetZero Carbon 2030'

Aéroports Côte d'Azur has been committed to a voluntary approach to reducing its environmental footprint for over 15 years, and is the first 100% carbon-neutral French airport group to commit

to not emit a single gram of greenhouse gases in just 10 years (instead of 30), without offsetting for the three airports it manages.

Nice Côte d'Azur Airport, France's third busiest airport, is the first airport in France to have achieved carbon neutrality in 2016, reducing its greenhouse gas emissions by 80% in 10 years!

The target is now zero CO₂ emissions without offsetting in the next ten years!

In addition, Nice airport also offers an excellent and green connection to the city center of Nice thanks to electic buses and new tram lines. www.nice.aeroport.fr

All three of the Group's airports are certified Carbon Neutral Level 3+ by the ACI.

hanks to the Ministry of the Environment, marine and land species are monitored, listed and protected, especially as part of the 'Pelagos' marine sanctuary.

Monaco also has two other marine reserves with rare species: Larvotto, and the second, on the coral-reef drop-off of Spélugues where red coral grows. On land, the Principality has identified 880 plant species including 18 heritage species.

The Rock is the refuge for peregrine falcons.

Breathe, the air is monitored

In order to prevent any discomfort or risk to health and the environment, an automated network of five approved air analysis stations has been operational throughout Monaco's territory for over twenty years. You can check the Air Quality Index (AQI) on the Government's Internet portal.

Seawater too!

The Principality monitors the physical and chemical quality of its coastal waters. Swimming water is also monitored from the beginning of May to the end of September with weekly sampling and analysis at each swimming site.

Managing Resources

Water and waste management is managed sustainably in the Principality. Monaco has two water supply sources. In recent years, increased awareness has led to a significant reduction in water consumption in Monaco.

And when it comes to Energy, the Climate Energy Plan aims to tackle climate change and prepare the State for these changes, following sustainable development principles.

Greenhouse gas reduction

The Principality of Monaco is committed to reducing its greenhouse gas emissions by 55% by 2030 compared to 1990 figures.

To achieve this objective, the Mission for Energy

Transition is taking action in the sectors that emit the most greenhouse gases in Monaco: road transport, waste treatment and energy use in buildings.



Responsible Tourism Destination

In Monaco, all the stakeholders are working towards achieving a more responsible tourism sector.

Most hotels have chosen environmental certification and soft mobility is


promoted through enhancing its public transport network. Awareness-raising actions are regularly organised.

The Tourism and Convention Authority launched 'Phase I' of its reflection on Responsible Tourism at the end of 2020.

In order to define a strategy, a White Paper has been drawn up for tourism stakeholders and an online questionnaire has been set up to gather the opinions of residents and visitors to the Principality.

The Villa Patricia in Villefranche-sur-Mer and the Camping Côté Mer *** located in the bay of Cannes, between the Esterel mountain range and Le Tanneron have also made commitments for the environment and developing the local economy.



Cap 3000: 'BiodiverCity,' a world first for a shopping centre!

At the end of 2019, **50** years after it was built, the 'Cap 3000' shopping centre underwent a major facelift. By expanding and undergoing a large-scale renovation while respecting biodiversity, Cap 3000 has become a textbook case and a worldwide example. Altarea Cogedim and TPF Ingénierie overcame all the environmental and regulatory difficulties of the site (coastal law, flood risk prevention plan, Natura 2000 zone). This is why the shopping centre has obtained the "BiodiverCity" certification, a world first!

Monaco Oceanographic Museum

The Oceanographic Museum is committed to minimising the impact of its activities on the environment. It reduces: its water and energy use (clean energy, LEDs, motion sensors on sinks, etc.), exhaust emissions (preference for hybrid or electric vehicles, in-house laundry, etc.), waste and recycling, and raises awareness among the young and visitors about the protecting the marine environment. MICE destinations and convention centres

The world-renowned **Palais des Festivals et des Congrès de Cannes** follows a sustainable development policy. Its proactive approach was already been recognised in 2009: the Palais became the first European centre to be triple certified.

Since then, the Palais has renewed its quadruple ISO certification: ISO 9001 - ISO 14001 - OHS18001-ISO 26000.

Similarly in Nice, the Acropolis Convention Centre is also ISO 14001 certified.

Other notable municipal projects include:

Sustainable urban planning in Mouans-Sartoux: thanks to protecting agricultural areas now being included in the local urbanisation plan, the town has created a municipal-run organic farm of 2 ha!

This provides all the organic produce to supply the local school canteens, achieving food self-sufficiency, the preservation of natural spaces and restanques (traditional farm terraces, a heritage feature of the Provençal landscape).

A 'green belt' in Cannes: In order to develop the natural and agricultural spaces available in the lower Siagne valley sector, Cannes has created an ambitious and environmental development project on a protected site of 75 hectares: 48 ha given over to organic and sustainable farming, allotments and an educational farm, 20 ha of natural areas, 2 ha of leisure areas and 5 ha dedicated to sports.

The Maison de l'environnement (Environment Centre) in Nice: this organisation promotes an eco-citizen approach to meet the challenges

an eco-citizen approach to meet the challenges of climate change and sustainable development.

It includes an educational garden and a library dedicated to environmental issues.

By train

The SNCF's fast and express trains (TGV, Corail trains) link the Côte d'Azur to all French regions and to all major European cities.

The TGV Méditerranée takes you from Paris to Toulon in 4 hours, Paris to Cannes in 5 hours and Paris to Nice in 5 hours and 25 minutes.

There are 5 TGV stations on the Côte d'Azur: Monaco, Nice-Ville, Antibes, Cannes and Saint-Raphaël Valescure.
