

SNOW & SKIING IN THE ALPES-MARITMES

FROM COASTAL TOURISM TO THE PEAKS: THE ASCENT OF WINTER SPORTS


A humanitarian mountain enthusiast, Chevalier Victor de Cessole joined the Club Alpin Français in 1889, then decided to introduce the Côte d'Azur peaks to the middle-classes holidaying on the coast of the Côte d'Azur. As Lord Brougham had done to attract the British middle-classes to Cannes, he therefore invited friends from high society to share his wonder before the beauty of these landscapes and practice skiing, sledging, ice-skating in the mountains of the Alpes-Maritimes.

The Chevalier de Cessole told of his expeditions through articles and photographs of the peaks and villages, and made friends with climbing celebrities. As he gradually conquered the summits, he created real archives about a territory which was then unknown. His aim: to **introduce the Alpes-Maritimes massif**, the least known of all the Alps. He never stopped photographing the rapidly changing mountains.

From his first traditional photographs, the unchanged mountain villages transformed gradually with **the conquest of the heights** by hiking and climbing through to the construction of refuges and the progressive equipping of snowy slopes. Cessole it was who launched skiing in the region by organising at Peïra Cava the first competition with the Chasseurs Alpins, before inaugurating the first downhill and ski-jump competitions at Beuil les Launes with the Ski Club des Alpes-Maritimes.

The Early 20th Century ... The Northern Alps were captured by this **new craze for winter sports**. The Alpes-Maritimes, in their turn, also started to have a certain attractiveness. 1936, the Valberg resort was established and the first ski-lift in the department was inaugurated. In 1937, France's third cable car was installed in Auron. From 1938, **the French Downhill Ski Championships** were organised there.

Today... The Côte d'Azur has become an international brand, but its hidden treasure still lies in the high country region. Indeed, the mountains, under the PURE ALPES brand, represents 80% of the Alpes-Maritimes land mass. Thanks to the power of the local authorities (the Department of the Alpes-Maritimes and the Métropole Nice Côte d'Azur) which have opened up these valleys over many years and invested in the resorts, the Côte d'Azur can today claim to be a remarkable and unexpected place for winter sports and discovering exceptional sites.





Set amid the high mountains, Val Pelens is a family resort in the village of Saint-Martin-d'Entraunes. Located in the peaks of the Pays de Grasse, on the northern slopes of the Cheiron mountain range, this ski resort is the closest to the coast (just 22 km as the crow flies). From the summit of the Cheiron, visitors can admire a unique 360° panoramic view stretching out across the Côte d'Azur, from the mountains of Estérel to the Alps, and as far as Corsica in clear weather.

Located at an altitude of between 1,400 and 1,800 m, it prides itself on a family-friendly atmosphere and offers guests the chance to enjoy a full-day of Alpine skiing, Nordic skiing, snowshoeing and biathlon on spaces dedicated to each of these activities, as well as some brand-new activities such as the Snooc, the Aspera Escape Game and the Explor Game.

Located in the town of Tende, in the Haute Roya, Castérino is a little paradise at the gateway to the Les Merveilles Valley, in the Mercantour National Park. Nestled at an altitude of 1,550 m, this hamlet is surrounded by such renowned summits as Mount Bégo, Chajol, the Monts Sainte Marie and more.

With its preserved mountain architecture and a vast, sunny mountain plateau, the site has been designed as place to disconnect and relax, far removed from the hustle and bustle of large Alpine-ski resorts.

The Nordic ski area includes 13 km of signposted cross-country ski trails for all levels (3 km of green trails, 5 km of blue trails and another 5 km of red trails), plus a toboggan run for the little ones. Not forgetting the 3 signposted trails for snowshoe hikers (around 1.5 hours each), which can be followed alone or with a companion from the Tende Guides Office, at an altitude of between 1,600 and 1,920 m.
