



CÔTE d'AZUR FRANCE is the destination's regional brand with 11,5 million tourists flocking here each year, generating some €12 billion in turnover.

From Saint-Tropez to Menton, along a serrated coastline etched with sublime bays and bordered by green hills, Côte d'Azur France is the ideal vacation destination if you love open-air activities and festivals.

Here, dream beaches and 5-star hotels, acclaimed festivals and the haunts of famous artists coexist with the secret coves and hidden villages nestled in the mountains.

Why? Well, very close to the iconic towns of Nice Côte d'Azur, Cannes and Antibes Juan-les-Pins, verdant valleys and high plateaus are beckoning ramblers, while hilltop villages with red roofs, illuminated each winter by the yellow mimosa flowers, invite you to sample the French 'joie de vivre' (joy of living).

# **Key figures**

#### USA

**USA ranks 2^{nd}** in terms of international tourist expenditures worldwide, with a **34% increase** in 2023 vs 2022. On the Côte d'Azur, American tourists rank  $3^{rd}$  in the number of international visitors, with more than 600,000 stays of an average duration of 5 nights, including:

- over 400,000 stays in hotels and self-catering residences.
- over 330,000 visitors arriving via Nice Côte d'Azur airport.
- An average local expenditure per person of \$200/day,
   i.e. an average budget of \$1,000 per visit.
- The high season is between 'June and September' accounts for 65% of stays.
- While more than 1,000 vacation homes owned by US citizens.

#### Canada

Canada ranks 7<sup>th</sup> in terms of international tourist expenditures worldwide, with a 36% increase in 2023 vs 2022.

On the Côte d'Azur, Canadian tourists rank 17<sup>th</sup> in the number of international visitors, with more than 90,000 stays of an average duration of 7 nights, including:

- over 48,000 stays in hotels and self-catering residences.
- over 70,000 visitors arriving via Nice Côte d'Azur airport.
- An average local expenditure per person of 100€/day,
   i.e. an average budget of 780€ per visit.
- ◆ The high season is between 'June and September' and accounts for 60% of stays.
- With 300 vacation homes owned by Canadian citizens or residents.

# The Escoffier Museum of Culinary Arts

The ambassador of modern French cuisine, Auguste Escoffier, is considered one of the greatest chefs in gastronomy. A pioneer in the culinary arts, he ruled the kitchens of the most renowned luxury hotels of the time and trained many chefs. After being the standard bearer for French gastronomy throughout the world, he died in Monaco in 1935 and his birthplace, located in Villeneuve-Loubet, became the Escoffier Museum of Culinary Art. Over 300 m², each room contains treasures for lovers of gastronomy: old stoves, sugar and chocolate sculptures, distinctions received...





# Long live "La Cuisine Nissarde"!

# Côte d'Azur wines

Vin de Bellet is a wine with a controlled designation of origin (AOC) harvested in the only vineyard inside Nice city limits. It is the only urban vineyard with an AOC, totally located within a large conurbation.

Off the coast of Cannes, on Saint Honorat Island, the monks of the **Abbaye de Lérins** cultivate a small vineyard of 8.5 ha, using traditional methods. Through these wines, the friars wish to highlight their values: the love of a job well done, fraternity and the search for excellence.

# Do not miss... rooftops

If having an aperitif is the custom on the Côte d'Azur, locals love to go up and nestle on the rooftops of hotels with their secret and trendy terraces with a panoramic view on the Mediterranean Sea.

Most of these rooftops are on the roofs of luxury hotels and are open on sunny days.

 Les Chefs au Sommet - Auron a high altitude culinary event. For a week, Auron celebrates the greatest chefs of the Côte d'Azur and the flavours of the mountains.

◆ La Cuisine Cannoise en Fête: on the Forville market, local producers, chefs, pastry chefs, fishmongers, bakers, etc. come together to promote the culinary identity of Cannes.

#### **SEPTEMBER**

A series of culinary and artistic demonstrations throughout the weekend at the Pôle Culturel Escoffier, while offering tastings and lunches created by exhibitors from the gastronomic market.

Ceramicists, potters, glassmakers, perfumers, the people of the Côte d'Azur are creative! Faithful to the traditions of the Côte d'Azur, artists and craftsmen exhibit their expertise and talent in many towns and villages in the Alpes-Maritimes.

Enter the doors of their workshops, discover their specialties and let these artists and craftsmen with the golden touch charm you.

# Grasse, World Capital of Perfume

Flowers have given Grasse its letters of nobility. The city was once adorned, both visually and olfactorily, with gardens and fields of jasmine flowers, roses and tuberoses, the three flowers which are queens in the art of perfumery. Even today, farmers grow them and gardens preserve this heritage bringing together all the scents of the Côte d'Azur. The major perfume houses take the raw materials that make up their fragrances from there, thus recognising Grasse's know-how and the quality of its flowers.



"Know-how related to perfume in the Pays de Grasse" has been registered since 2018 on the representative list of the intangible cultural heritage of humanity by UNESCO. This distinction relates to the cultivation of perfume plants, knowledge about both natural raw materials and their processing and the art of composing perfumes which have been developed by the craftsmen of the Pays de Grasse.

Discover the three historical perfumeries in Grasse: the **Fragonard, Galimard and Molinard** perfumeries, all of which offer guided tours and perfume creation workshops.



# The Art of Glass in Biot

Since the second half of the 20th century, blown glass has become the symbol of this village on the Côte d'Azur. With its Ville et Métiers d'Art label, Biot has become the capital of contemporary glass in France. Several glassworks have set up there to showcase the subtleties of glass art.

A visit not to be missed: **La Verrerie de Biot**, the source of the Biot tradition of blown glass, the establishment's trademark, welcomes you for a journey through the world of glass creation.

You must also visit **the Centre du Verre Contemporain - Famille Pierini**, housed in a 15<sup>th</sup>-century building. Antoine Pierini, master glassmaker, designs breath-taking glass pieces.



# **Vallauris, Capital of Ceramics**

How can we talk about Vallauris without mentioning ceramics and its most famous ambassador Picasso?

It was in 1948 that the master, charmed by the know-how of the city of potters such as **Roger Capron**, **Jean Derval** and... **Suzanne Ramier**, settled there to devote himself to ceramics.

The popularity of the painter attracted a crowd of curious people, personalities flocked there, artists settled there to learn ceramics in their turn, thus contributing to the revival of this activity.

Today, with the Ville et Métiers d'Art label, Vallauris is a setting where

ceramicists, potters, artists and craftsmen express themselves, perpetuating their passion and their know-how.

The city now has workshops led by large families of potters from generation to generation, joined by a new wave of young ceramicists with innovative and ambitious projects.



### Seaside...

Snorkelling, paddleboarding, canoeing, sailing, freediving... fill up on natural sensations, without an engine.

#### **Paddleboard**

Highly fashionable, Stand-Up Paddle (SUP) is the ultimate relaxation activity that respects the sea. With its calm sea, its little secret coves and its islands, the Côte d'Azur lends itself particularly well to this. Among the most beautiful spots, we recommend: the Lérins Islands off Cannes; la Siagne from Robinson beach in Mandelieu-La Napoule; the Cap d'Antibes and the Baie des Milliardaires or even Menton for a spot facing the old town and its colourful facades

Are you a speed lover? Try out the **electric surfboard** which can reach 35 km/h. The even more sensational **electric foil** allows you to fly over the water at up to 30 km/h, without noise or pollution!

#### Freediving and scuba diving

The Deep Blue Sea is always a paradise for divers and freedivers, experienced or novices. Depending on your level and your desires, the Côte d'Azur has many hidden underwater treasures.

#### Snorkelling

Among the remarkable and unmissable sites for snorkelling is the underwater discovery trail at Pointe de l'Aiguille. Accessible to all, it allows you to observe, recognise and be aware of the fauna and flora of the Mediterranean shallows.

#### **Underwater Eco-Museum**

A rare spectacle, the first eco-museum in France and the Mediterranean that can be visited while snorkelling! Equipped with mask and snorkel, travel a hundred metres from the southern shore of Sainte-Marguerite Island and discover, less than five metres down, six monumental statues by the artist Jason deCaires Taylor.

Trail-running, tree climbing, via ferrata, the longest zipwire in France, paragliding, canyoning, rafting, caving... Do you dare to climb the mountains?

#### "Tout schuss" in the ski resorts!

Fifteen resorts and 600 km of slopes only 90 minutes from the coast, the resorts of the Alpes-Maritimes benefit from a unique offer: the sea view from six resorts, record sunshine, activities for all tastes and varied entertainment for the après-ski.

Three major areas for winter sports enthusiasts: Auron, Isola 2000 and Valberg.

On the coast, in the high or middle country, there is no shortage of hikes in the Alpes-Maritimes. Through villages and hamlets, at the top of the peaks, in the Alps or on the shores of the Mediterranean, what will your itinerary be?

Are you athletic? Long-distance hiking lovers? You will find what you are looking for among the ten "GR" routes that run through the Alpes-Maritimes. 1,200 km of trails, tracks and paths await you all year round! Among them, names to make you dream: "Grande Traversée du Mercantour", "Balcons de la Méditerranée", "La Grande Traversée des Alpes"...

### In the saddle!

With its 1,800km of cycle routes, the Côte d'Azur offers itineraries for all levels, from a family seaside ride to climbing the highest passes, such as the Col de la Bonette, for fans of the yellow jersey!

In 2024, Nice proudly hosted the Arrival of the Tour de France!



The "tourist loops" are "discovery circuits" that immerse you in magnificent territories where gastronomy, geology and history are on the agenda. Reserved for the most athletic, the "Sporting Loops" cross the wild territories of the high country.

For the most diligent, setting off for several days, alone, with friends or family, is also possible by tackling the "Grand Tour of the Préalpes d'Azur" (six days) or the "Mediterranean by Bike".

# The Côte d'Azur by train: all aboard!

#### Le Train des Merveilles

From the Mediterranean coast to the Alps, this train takes us on the historic route of the salt trade. Far from the crowds, this route promises a panoramic journey in the mountains, through the mediaeval villages of Sospel, Saorge, Breil-sur-Roya and Tende, its terminus, where the Musée des Merveilles can be explored. In summer, a tour guide is present on the morning train. Please note, currently undergoing renovation work, temporary closure until the end of 2025.

#### Le Train des Pignes

Along the 151km of the Nice > Digne-les-Bains line, the centenarian steam Train des Pignes rocks you to the rhythm of the last century from Nice to Haute Provence, from the land of olive trees to that of chestnut trees. An opportunity to stop in the mediaeval villages of Entrevaux and Annot, Pays des Grès, up to the Pays de Fugeret, at an altitude of more than 800 m!

#### The Corniche d'Or by Train

Unique on the coast, the train line that connects Nice to Marseille takes us along the coast and through the Estérel and its breath-taking landscapes where the red rocks literally flow into the Mediterranean. A postcard landscape!



#### **OUR FAVOURITE: The Route du Mimosa**

Over 130km, the Route du Mimosa crosses eight municipalities from Bormes-les-Mimosas (Var) to Grasse (Alpes-Maritimes), obviously passing through Mandelieu-La Napoule, mimosa capital. This tourist route, recommended from January to March, is a typical symbol of the Côte d'Azur in

winter, offering touring holidays, in the mild climate, between azure blue and sunny yellow.

Between the coast and the forest massifs, this route introduces you to the riches of the Côte d'Azur, its authenticity, its unique terroir, its festive atmosphere, its surprising heritage through the fragrant scents of mimosa.

#### Our favorites for 2025

#### ◆ La Malmaison – Cannes

The contemporary art center of Cannes, an iconic building on the Croisette will reopen on January 31st following extensive renovation and restructuring work, which will triple the current exhibition space.

#### ◆ The Fondation Maeght in Saint-Paul-de-Vence

Founded in 1964 by the couple Marguerite and Aimé Maeght, this major landmark in contemporary art is an incredible place of ambition and creativity graced by numerous artists: Chagall, Léger, Juan Miró, Giacometti. With its new route around the 500m² extension and two new exhibition rooms inaugurated in 2024, the Fondation perpetuates the avant-garde focus of the place.

#### ◆ FAMM - The Female Artists of Mougins Museum

Completely renovated in 2024, the Mougins Museum of Classical Art has been reborn around a unique concept that places women at the centre of art history. Thanks to the Levett collection to become the first European museum dedicated to female artists!







# UNESCO nominations in #CotedAzurFrance

- July 2021: 44th session of the World Heritage Committee in China in Fuzhou
  - "Nice, the winter resort city of the Riviera," registered on the UNESCO World Heritage List.
- ◆ December 2021: Cannes designated as a "UNESCO Creative City" in the cinema category. Cannes joins the 295 international creative cities recognized by UNESCO which have the shared aim of promoting creativity as a major asset of development in the world.
- ◆ December 2021: the Monastic Island of Lérins (Saint-Honorat). A crucial step taken for the inclusion of this jewel of UNESCO world heritage in the strong interest taken by the French government in presenting the application from Cannes in the near future to the UNESCO World Committee.
- December 2018: 'Pays de Grasse Perfumery Expertise' on the UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage List: this prestigious distinction is a fitting tribute to a joint effort by the Côte d'Azur's flower producers, master perfumers and other traditional perfume industry firms.

# In the footsteps of Picasso in #CotedAzurFrance: a cultural and tourist itinerary

Strength and beauty of landscapes, intensity of light, brilliance of colours, the Côte dyAzur has been a source of inspiration in the life and work of many artists.

Attracted by these lands of the South, Picasso found here a place to stay and create to his measure.

**Antibes Juan-les-Pins (1946):** Picasso moved to Château Grimaldi to paint. Now the Picasso museum, many of the artist's works dedicated to the Mediterranean are presented there.


At the invitation of the curator of the Grimaldi castle, Dor de la Souchère, Picasso used part of the castle as a studio. There he painted La Joie de Vivre and The Sea Urchin Eater...

**Vallauris Golfe-Juan (1947-1955):** It was in Vallauris, where the pottery tradition has an important place, that Picasso discovered ceramics. He produced more than 4,000 works at the Fournas workshop and chose the Romanesque chapel of Vallauris to paint the War and Peace fresco.

Cannes (1955): Picasso acquired "La Villa Californie" with an unobstructed view of the sea. An ideal place to stay and create, he set up his studio there and produced numerous works there, including the beginning of the series devoted to Las Meninas.

Mougins (1961-1973): Picasso died in Mougins in 1973 in his last residence, Notre-Dame-de-Vie, which was also his final studio.





Every year, the world's spotlights shine on the Cannes Film Festival, its famous red carpet and its procession of stars, but let's not forget that the Côte d'Azur has had an intense love affair with cinema for more than a century!






