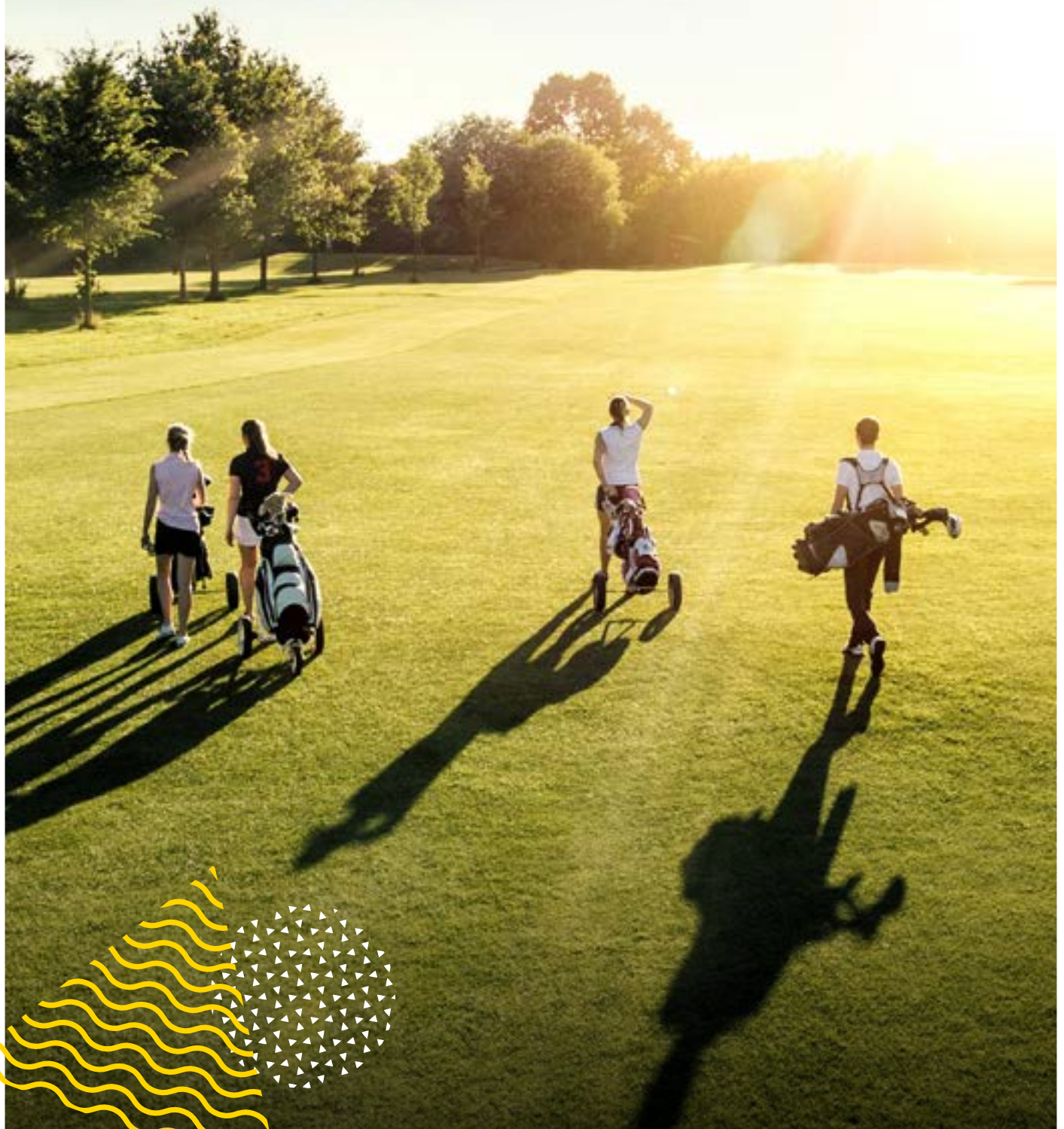


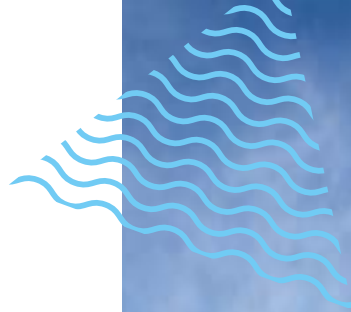

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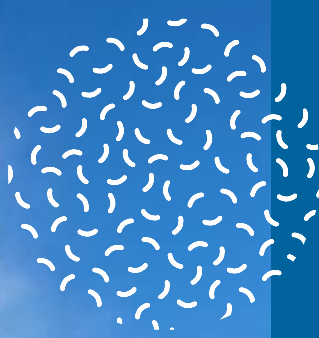

The Côte d'Azur France, a golfing destination for every season

As early as the 19th century, with the arrival of European aristocracy in search of idyllic landscapes and sunny skies, golf courses began to appear and develop along the Côte d'Azur. The very first – the Old Course Cannes-Mandelieu, inaugurated in 1891 – is one of the oldest golf courses in all of France. At the time, golf was reserved for the elite. It symbolised nobility, elegance, good taste, and a refined lifestyle, catering to a prestigious clientele who found a sporting and tourist offer on the Côte d'Azur befitting their expectations.

Since then, golf has taken on an entirely new dimension in our region thanks to a highly diverse offering. With around twenty clubs – half of them full 18-hole courses and most open all year round – our destination now offers layouts suited to golfers of all levels, from beginners to seasoned professionals.

As a major driver of attractiveness for the Côte d'Azur, golf provides us with another opportunity to continue developing and diversifying the tourism appeal of our destination. The idea is to attract golfers all year round, across the whole region, and to establish the Côte d'Azur as a benchmark among golfing destinations to be enjoyed in every season.

Good news for the Côte d'Azur: the IGTM – International Golf Travel Market – will return to Cannes in 2025 and 2026, after hosting its 20th edition here in 2017. The world's leading golf travel trade show brings together some 500 tour operators, 15,000 business meetings, and around a hundred specialised golf media outlets. This not-to-be-missed gathering of the global golfing world shines a spotlight on the entire Côte d'Azur, from the coastline to the foothills and high country.

This guide is the perfect occasion to highlight the golf clubs of the Côte d'Azur: their histories, their courses, their champions and their latest news. It is also an opportunity to showcase the extensiveness and diversity of tourism on the Côte d'Azur which makes any stay a true delight: gastronomy, culture, nature, landscapes between sea and mountains... a lifestyle to be enjoyed year-round.

In the winter or summer, for training or leisure, we welcome you to Côte d'Azur France, a land of golf steeped in heritage with a bright future on the horizon!

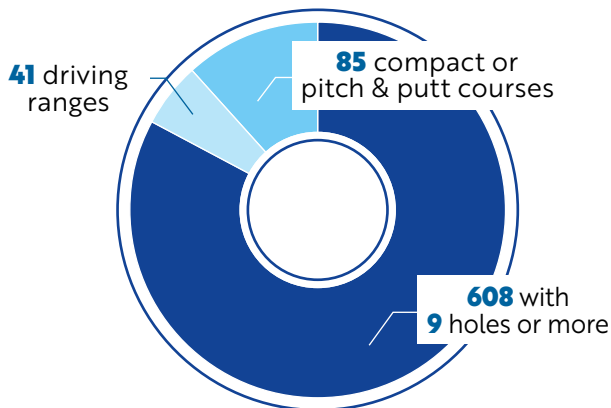

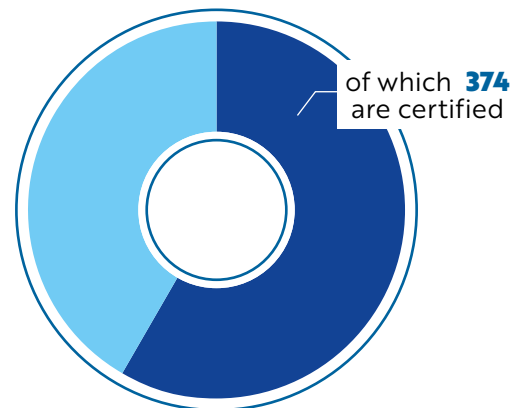

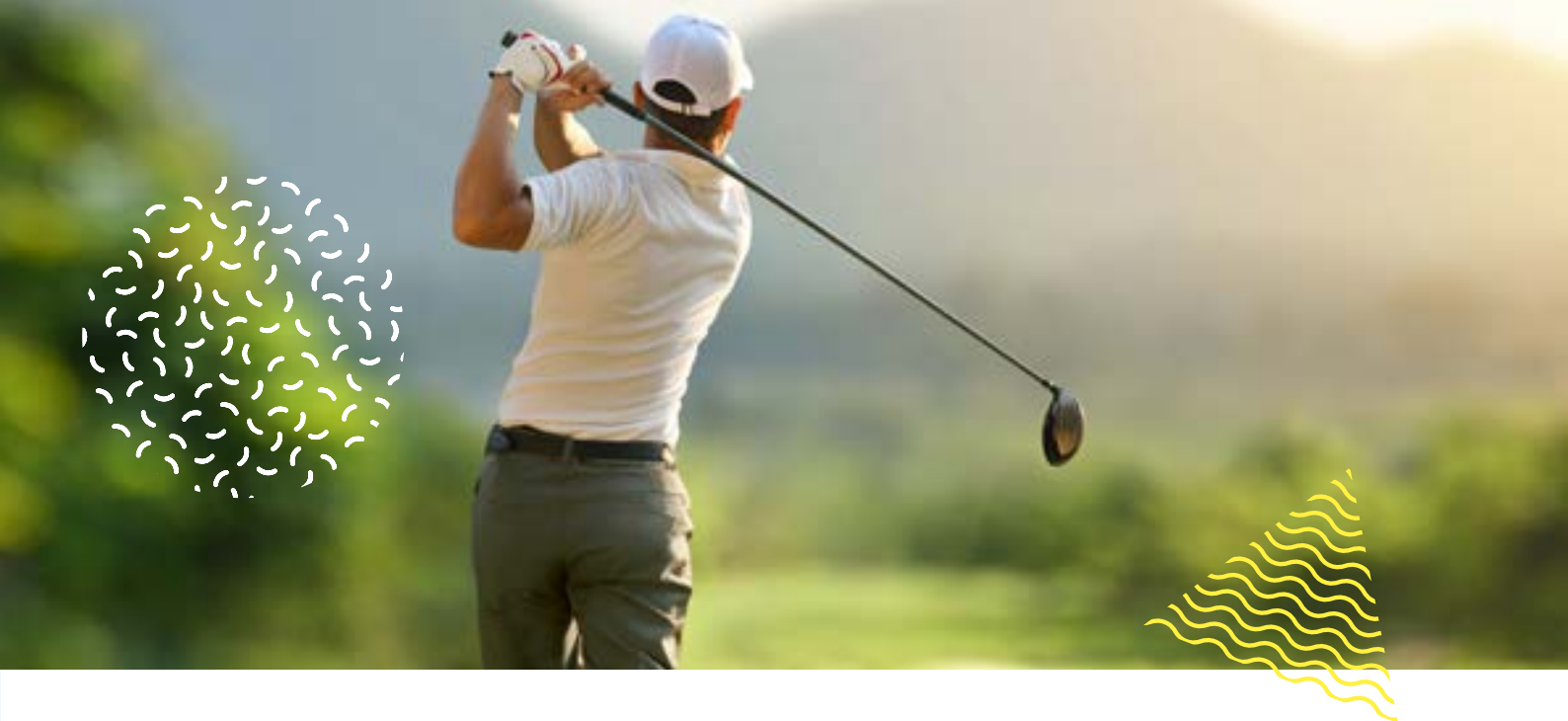

BY TRAIN

For those who enjoy taking their time, the train offers a sustainable alternative for reaching the Côte d'Azur from Paris at reasonable prices. Allow **six hours for the journey**.

The **night train** also provides the unique experience of leaving Paris in the evening (from Gare d'Austerlitz) and waking up the following morning on the French Riviera.

The **Marseille-Nice line** serves several stations in the Var and Alpes-Maritimes, giving travellers the chance to get off close to their holiday destination.

Côte d'Azur courses committed to sustainable play

The Côte d'Azur offers an **exceptional natural setting** for golfing between sea and mountains. Over the last years, in a move towards more sustainable models, golf clubs across the region have been introducing initiatives to **reduce their impact on natural resources and to protect the landscapes** that make this destination so unique.

More responsible water management, a gradual shift towards soil- and biodiversity-friendly maintenance practices, better awareness among players and staff... These are just some of the actions that demonstrate a **collective determination** to adapt the game of golf to today's environmental challenges, while upholding high standards of hospitality and course quality.

The Golf & Biodiversity Programme and Label launched in 2018 with the support of the French National Museum of Natural History, the Golf for Biodiversity Programme has a clear ambition: to achieve excellence in understanding, conserving, and enhancing the natural heritage of golf courses.

Initiatives developed by some Côte d'Azur golf clubs



Old Course Cannes-Mandelieu

In 2024, **Golf de Cannes-Mougins** converted all its fairways to grass species requiring less water. It has introduced a number of initiatives since being awarded the Silver Biodiversity Label: raising ecological awareness among young golfers at the academy, installing nesting boxes, removing nighttime lighting, and delaying mowing, among more.

Like other regional courses, **Golf de la Grande Bastide** has undertaken a plant conversion programme. The approach involves replacing water-intensive grasses with more resilient and economical species. The aim is to reduce water consumption by up to 35%, particularly through smart irrigation systems, while maintaining high playing quality. It also helps limit long-term water withdrawals from the natural environment.

In 2023, the **Old Course Golf Club in Cannes-Mandelieu** marked a major milestone in its commitment to sustainability by implementing an innovative irrigation system that reuses treated wastewater. Thanks to a 200-meter pipeline connected to the nearby treatment plant, the golf course is now able to irrigate its grounds without drawing on the region's drinking water supply.

Golf de Saint Donat has become a reference point in terms of equipment and eco-management, with initiatives such as plant conversion, replacing lawns with less water-demanding turf varieties. It has also created and installed natural habitats for reptiles, amphibians, and bats (helping to control insects and reduce pesticide use). It is equipped with composters, and the compost is used to enrich the soil naturally.

At the **Monte-Carlo Golf Club**, greenkeepers receive training from naturalists to avoid mowing certain plants. Only organic products are used for maintenance, and the course also makes regular use of eco-grazing with goats and sheep to maintain its valleys.

Since 1 July 2025, certain clubs – including those in the **Resonance Golf Collection group** – have implemented a **total smoking ban across all outdoor areas**, in line with new national regulations.

This measure ensures a smoke-free environment for everyone's well-being. It reflects **golf's commitment** to providing a healthy, respectful, relaxing setting.

GOLF OLD COURSE CANNES-MANDELIEU

The Legend

One of the four oldest golf clubs in France, this emblematic venue was created in 1891, envisioned by the renowned architect Harry Shapland Colt. Nestled in the shade of 4,000 umbrella pines and just a stone's throw from the Mediterranean, it embodies elegance, tradition, and a passion for golf.

The course extends over 74 hectares in the heart of a century-old pine forest. Originally, the layout featured 9 holes, nicknamed the "Grand-Duc" in tribute to Grand Duke Michael of Russia, a golf enthusiast exiled on the Côte d'Azur. Today, the site offers a complete golfing experience with two courses and a performance centre.

The main 18-hole course is flat yet demanding, lined with majestic pines. Its unique feature is the crossing of the coastal river La Siagne by ferry between holes 3 and 13, a rare and memorable experience. Sea breezes and the Mediterranean scents of pines, mimosas, and eucalyptus bring each round an unforgettable atmosphere.

The historic Grand-Duc course has returned to its original 9-hole layout after a period when it was temporarily reduced to 6 holes. Accessible, varied, and well-paced, it allows players of all levels to train, improve, or simply enjoy a shorter round in natural surroundings.

The performance centre, fully dedicated to training and progression, includes a driving range, a grass performance zone, and a compact 9-hole Pitch & Putt course, known as the "Petit Prince." Specially designed for the short game, it caters equally to beginners and experienced players.

A place of sport but also of legend, the Old Course hosts major tournaments each year. Once frequented by royalty and film stars, it has retained its timeless charm. The Norman-style clubhouse, set beneath the shade of a centuries-old umbrella pine, extends this privileged experience, blending historical heritage with Riviera elegance.

From a golfer's lunch to a refined business meal, or simply a privileged moment of relaxation, the Old Course restaurant and clubhouse welcome everyone in an inviting and timeless setting.

RIVIERA GOLF DE BARBOSSI

The Artistic Course

The only golf course on the Côte d'Azur where sport meets contemporary art, the Riviera Golf de Barbossi offers a unique experience at the foot of the Estérel mountains. Between preserved nature, monumental sculptures, and a strategic layout, every round becomes a journey.

Designed by Robert Trent Jones Senior and inaugurated in 1991, the Riviera Golf de Barbossi stretches across 65 hectares within the largest private estate on the Côte d'Azur, the Domaine de Barbossi. This exceptional destination combines golf, a vineyard, and an equestrian centre, providing a comprehensive universe devoted to a refined art of living.

Laid out among three lakes, the Riou de l'Argentière river, and lush Mediterranean vegetation – including maritime pines, centuries-old cork oaks, olive trees, and mimosas – the course alternates between wide perspectives and more technical passages. Its tee shots demand careful strategy to avoid cleverly placed bunkers, while its undulating, well-defended greens require great precision on approach shots.

Accessible to golfers of all levels, the course combines technical challenge with sheer enjoyment.

A rare feature: 22 contemporary sculptures punctuate the fairways, created by renowned artists such as Georges Boisgontier and Max Cartier. This open-air gallery transforms each round into a cultural experience, where every hole becomes an encounter between sport and artistic creation.

The Riviera Golf Academy – which received the 2021 Développement Label – offers learning and improvement programmes tailored to all ages and abilities, further enhancing the appeal of this exceptional site.

ROYAL MOUGINS GOLF RESORT

The Exacting One

In the heart of a rolling, unspoilt estate, Royal Mougins offers an impressively challenging layout and unique panoramic views. Just a stone's throw from Cannes, it stands out as one of the most prestigious golfing destinations on the Côte d'Azur.

Designed by Robert von Hagge, creator of more than 250 courses worldwide, Royal Mougins stretches across 75 rolling hectares near Cannes. Created in 1993, this 18-hole layout attracts players seeking both a technical challenge and an exceptional golfing experience. As a semi-private course, it mainly welcomes members, their guests, and resort clients who appreciate its high-end services. Its preserved environment and personalised service make it a must-play address for demanding golfers.

This course, with its striking contours, stands out for the precision required from the first tee and for the variety of shots to be played. Its fairways wind through wooded hills and valleys, punctuated by 60 bunkers and 7 water hazards that shape the game and demand strategic play. Two signature holes leave a lasting impression.

Hole 2, "Le saut de l'Ange" (The Angel's Leap) is a spectacular par 3 plunging 30 metres towards a green encircled by water. Hole 9 is a long par 4 where perfectly placed shots are essential to reach the elevated, sloping green. Every hole offers fresh perspectives, delivering a game that is both technically demanding and visually striking.

Recognised with awards such as World Golf Awards as "France's Best Golf Hotel", Royal Mougins appeals as much for the quality of its design as for its preserved natural setting. The club spirit, marked by a warm, international atmosphere, makes every round feel like an exclusive and memorable experience.

GOLF DE CANNES-MOUGINS

The Committed One

Nestled in the heart of the Valmasque forest, the Golf de Cannes-Mougins embodies elegance and heritage. With its wooded fairways, fast greens, and prestigious history, it appeals to golf enthusiasts in search of excellence and a protected natural setting.

Laid out amidst the Valmasque forest, the course is slightly sloped, crossed by the Bouillide river, and dotted with water features. Originally designed by Harry Colt in 1923, it was remodelled by Peter Alliss and Dave Thomas in 1977 and refined again by Mackenzie & Ebert in 2015. It retains the spirit of the great British layouts while meeting modern standards. The course delivers a complete challenge in a preserved natural environment, where meticulous upkeep reflects the club's high standards and the passion of its members.

It is relatively technical, as the fine fairways lined by pines and Mediterranean plants, combine with fast greens to demand accuracy and strategy while offering a real challenge for golfers of all levels. Every shot counts, requiring precision to avoid pitfalls and respect the superb design. The Clubhouse, a listed historic building, is a former 18th-century olive oil mill

where the aqueduct and old presses have been beautifully preserved.

Regularly ranked among France's finest courses, the club hosted the Cannes Open for 14 years, a major European Tour event featuring champions such as Greg Norman, Severiano Ballesteros, and Ian Woosnam. Committed to sustainability, Cannes-Mougins was the first club in the South of France to earn an RSE certification in 2016. In 2021, it was awarded the Silver "Golf for Biodiversity" label by the French Golf Federation, demonstrating its commitment to combining tradition, technical excellence and respect for its exceptional natural environment.

GOLF COUNTRY CLUB DE SAINT DONAT

The Essential

At the gateway to Grasse and Cannes, this exceptional course unfolds amidst a fragrant Mediterranean landscape of magnolias, jasmine and umbrella pines. It combines technical precision with Riviera charm in a resolutely modern spirit.

Designed by Robert Trent Jones Jr, in collaboration with Michel Benedetti, the 18-hole course is crossed by the Mourachonne river, a tributary of the Siagne. Its layout favours accuracy over power, in the spirit of a typically American-style "target golf" course. Throughout the round, players are faced with a variety of challenges: well-defended greens, tight tee shots, and water hazards that demand a thoughtful strategy.

The river plays a decisive role, cutting across several fairways and complicating approaches to the greens. Hole 3 perfectly illustrates this challenge: considered the toughest on the course, it requires an approach to an island green. Further along, the narrow, downhill Hole 15 is guarded by a branch of the Mourachonne before the green. A large shared water feature at holes 10 and 18 ramps up the technical demands of the back nine, while the opening holes, marked by gentle mounds and majestic trees, call for finesse and accuracy.

Nestled in this land of perfume between sea and mountains, this course enchants with its preserved natural setting, where umbrella pines, century-old oaks and Mediterranean flora create a unique backdrop. The estate also offers a 9-hole compact course dedicated to practice and training, along with a renowned golf academy, the birthplace of champions such as Romain Langasque.

A true showcase of the Benedetti Group's expertise, Saint Donat has become a reference point thanks to its modern facilities, optimised irrigation systems and eco-responsible approach, including the use of organic fertilisers

GOLF DU CLAUX AMIC

The Tactical One

Between sea and mountains, the Golf du Claux Amic offers a rolling course set within a former 19th-century hunting estate. With its wild scenery, breathtaking views and technical layout, it stands as a truly unique destination on the Côte d'Azur.

At 500 metres above sea level, the course is enclosed by old stone walls and remains a natural haven for deer. Designed in 1992 by Jean-Pascal Fourès, it follows the contours of rugged terrain dotted with cork oaks and pines, where the architect carved fairways directly into the rock. Acquired by the Contini family in 1998, the course underwent major renovation before reopening in 2013.

The layout is hilly and demanding, favouring precision over power. Narrow fairways, dense woodland, steep slopes, and strategically placed bunkers call for careful shot management. Water is rarely in play, giving way to a design that rewards accuracy and thoughtful play. Here, every shot matters, or the ball may vanish into the vegetation.

The course also captivates with its spectacular views. Hole 3 descends towards the Bay of Cannes and the Lérins Islands, while Hole 6 opens onto the striking red hills of the Estérel massif. Moreover, the peaceful surroundings, between sea and mountains, lend Claux Amic its singular charm. Here, every round feels like a timeless interlude, a blend of sport and contemplation, in a setting where nature and technical challenge meet in harmony.

GOLF DE LA GRANDE BASTIDE

The Contemporary

In the heart of the Nice hinterland, Golf de la Grande Bastide attracts players with its contemporary design by Cabell Robinson. With its wide fairways, strategic bunkering, and eco-responsible vision, the course offers a technical yet accessible challenge for all levels of play.

Located in Châteauneuf-de-Grasse, the 18-hole course unfolds across gently rolling countryside, with superb views over Grasse, Opio and Châteauneuf. Designed by Cabell Robinson, the former associate of Robert Trent Jones Sr, its modern structure combines broad fairways with greens carefully defended by bunkers and water hazards.

This “open space” design makes the course accessible to beginners while still posing a true technical challenge to experienced golfers. Every tee shot requires strategic thinking, while accuracy into the greens is essential to score well on consistently high-quality putting surfaces.

The Golf de la Grande Bastide has recently invested in a state-of-the-art practice area: 15 spacious bays overlooking a 200-metre driving zone for perfecting long game technique. A 5,000 m² short game zone, including bunker play, chipping and putting, designed to hone up to 80% of shots.

Committed to sustainability, the club has launched an ambitious flora conversion programme, reducing water consumption by 35% thanks to the introduction of less demanding grasses. Three fragrant plant species, including roses, have been added to the course, reflecting the heritage of the Pays de Grasse.

The clubhouse restaurant, Victoire, overlooks the course and completes an offering designed to combine technical excellence, comfort and respect for the natural setting. Close to Golf d’Opio Valbonne, the site enjoys a privileged position for a golf break at the heart of the Côte d’Azur.

OPIO VALBONNE RESORT

The Gallo-Roman One

Set between sea and mountains in 220 hectares of unspoilt nature, the Opio Valbonne Golf Resort stands out for its strategic layout, remarkable natural heritage, and premium facilities. Here, technical play meets Riviera elegance.

Nestled within wooded grounds dotted with century-old pines and green oaks, the course unfolds across gently rolling terrain. Its most distinctive feature is the presence of a Gallo-Roman aqueduct which is discreetly integrated into the landscape, a rare heritage gem on the Côte d'Azur.

The layout is marked by a clear contrast between the outward nine and the return: The front nine favours precision, demanding controlled approaches, and iron play. The back nine is more open, calling for long, accurate woods and offering varied shot-making opportunities that test every aspect of the swing. The signature Hole 18, a spectacular par 3 overlooking the Brasserie La Bégude, brings the round to a visually stunning and technically challenging close.

Continuous improvement ensures year-round quality, with the complete refurbishment of greens and irrigation systems. **The resort also features Château de la Bégude, a 4-star hotel with spa and pool**, making it the ideal place to combine sport and relaxation in style.

Managed by Resonance Golf Collection, a leading operator of premium golf destinations, Opio Valbonne combines tradition and modernity. With its protected natural setting, balanced design and high-end facilities, it is an essential reference for golfers seeking both challenge and comfort.

GOLF CLUB DE BIOT

The Maritime One

Located between Nice and Cannes, beneath the perched village of Biot, the Golf Club de Biot lies in a landscape where wooded hills meet a river valley. One of the oldest courses on the Côte d'Azur, it combines tradition and technical play within a preserved natural setting.

The course is overlooked by the village of Biot, stretching along the Brague Valley just two kilometres from the Mediterranean coast. Inspired by Northern European layouts, it was designed in 1930 by Peter Gannon and Percy Boomer. It remains true to a simple approach with a relatively flat, easy-to-walk design where precision is valued over power.

The Brague River and its tributaries shape the game, skirting or crossing several fairways. Slightly elevated greens, originally designed to withstand flooding, add challenge to approach shots. Accessible to players of all levels, the course nevertheless demands accuracy and strategy to navigate its natural hazards. At times, fairways open onto wide views of the hills, while more wooded passages recall the nearby

Valmasque forest. This variety of playing situations, between water hazards and open stretches, gives the layout a lively and engaging rhythm.

Over the years, the site has been modernised with the renovation of several greens, including the addition of a putting green and a 15-bay practice range with covered, heated stations, complemented by a specialised academy. This technical upgrade enhances a preserved natural setting whose location, between sea and back country, remains a major asset for golfers seeking variety and thoughtful play.

MONTE-CARLO GOLF CLUB

The Panoramic One

Suspended between sea and mountains, the Monte-Carlo Golf Club is truly one of a kind. At 900 metres above sea level, it combines technical challenge, century-old heritage, and breathtaking views over the Mediterranean and the Principality of Monaco.

Perched high above La Turbie, the course was originally designed in 1911 by Willie Park Jr, a pioneer of golf architecture. Commissioned by the English community holidaying in Monte-Carlo and supported by the Société des Bains de Mer, it blends the demands of mountain golf with the majesty of a maritime panorama. As the 27th golf course built in France and the second oldest on the Côte d'Azur after the Old Course Cannes-Mandelieu, it retains a rare authenticity. It was later remodelled in 1983 by the Club Committee.

The rugged terrain calls for constant accuracy. Narrow fairways alternate between climbs and descents, interspersed with dog-legs and blind shots that require careful course management. Compact greens, often well-guarded, demand pinpoint approaches to secure a score. At this altitude, the sometimes unpredictable effects of the wind add another layer of challenge, turning every round into a true test of skill and adaptability.

Several holes have become legendary, such as Hole 12, plunging towards the sea and the Principality; and Hole 3, shaped by Henry Cotton, winding through the garrigue

landscape. Over the decades, the club has modernised its facilities while preserving the historic charm that sets it apart.

A centenary institution, it has hosted champions such as Henry Cotton and Max Faulkner, along with the Monte-Carlo Professional Open, once part of the European Tour. A number of public personalities, from Roger Federer to Michael Douglas, have also walked its fairways. Today, the Monte-Carlo Golf Club still embodies the perfect alliance of sporting tradition, timeless elegance and an exceptional natural setting.

The Monte-Carlo Golf Club is actively engaged in environmental responsibility, and has earned the French Golf Federation's Bronze biodiversity label.

VICTORIA GOLF CLUB

The Technical 9-Hole

In the peaceful setting of the Val Martin Park, Victoria Golf Club offers a technical 9-hole course where preserved nature, rolling terrain, and water features call for precise and strategic play.

Located in the heart of Valbonne Sophia Antipolis, on the site of a former historic spa, Victoria Golf Club has since 1986 showcased a layout by French architect Michel Gayon. Rated 3 stars by Golf Stars, the course blends technical challenge with immersion in a natural environment.

Designed as a learning ground for players of all levels, the course emphasises strategy through its undulating fairways, well-placed bunkers, and water hazards that spice up the game. Mastering sidehill lies, keeping the ball straight, and handling natural obstacles are all essential to succeed on this par 34 course measuring 2,342 metres.

From the opening hole, the tone is set: a demanding par 4, defended by an elevated green and a bunker lying below it. Hole 7 offers one of the most beautiful panoramas: this downhill tee shot offers sweeping views of the forest and ponds and is punctuated by a strategic water hazard.

Among its highlights, the signature Hole 5, a 145-metre par 3, plays over a 50-metre drop onto a double-plateau green, fiercely defended by trees and a front bunker. The golf also features five large practice zones and a driving range (150 m / 260 m) with 50 bays, including 8 covered.

Fully integrated into the Club Med resort, it benefits from the convivial atmosphere of the village. Here, sports facilities, a pool in the olive grove, bars, a spa, a sauna, and a hammam complete this unique golf experience for a perfect blend of performance and relaxation.

Specialising in high-altitude courses, Olivier Dongradi designed the layout in 2007 to follow the natural contours perfectly. Perched at 1,700 m, this par 34, 2,308-metre course offers an authentic and demanding experience within a preserved mountain setting. Here, there are no fences or artificial barriers: play opens onto the horizon, and it is not uncommon to spot deer, roe deer or even marmots during your round.

The course features over 200 metres of positive elevation change, testing both endurance and precision. Every shot requires adaptation, with your feet rarely level with the ball. The course's signature Hole 4 plays from a promontory to a narrow green below, often swept by wind, offering spectacular views from Mont Saint Honorat to the Mercantour massif and Mont Mounier.

Committed to minimal ecological impact and awarded the Flocon Vert label in 2018, the resort limits irrigation to tees and greens using a local spring, while the remainder of the course is naturally replenished by summer storms. Maintenance is carried out exclusively with organic products, and even the golf carts are 100% electric.

To complete the experience, the club offers a 20-bay practice range, three training areas, and a restaurant-bar, welcoming players and visitors from May to October, combining the joy of the game with alpine relaxation.

Born in Grasse in 1995, Romain Langasque discovered golf in childhood on the greens of Saint-Donat in Grasse.

Trained within the national federation structures, he quickly distinguished himself in major amateur events. In 2015, he won the British Amateur Championship, a historic achievement for a French golfer.

The following year, he became the first French amateur to make the cut at the legendary Masters at Augusta. He then launched his professional career with success, delivering strong results on the Challenge Tour and earning his place on the European Tour.

In 2016, he partnered with Victor Dubuisson in the World Cup of Golf, finishing second – the best result ever achieved by France. In 2020, he recorded his first European Tour victory at the ISPS Handa Wales Open following a thrilling final round.

Today, Romain Langasque stands as one of the pillars of French golf, driven by early talent and unwavering determination.

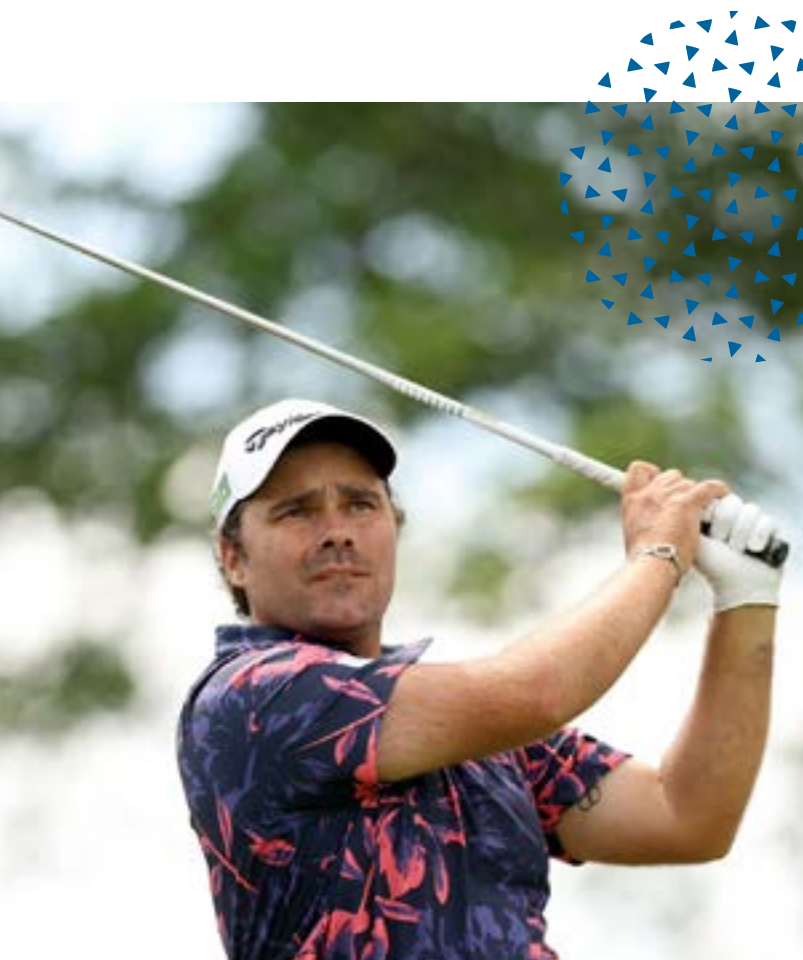
Star of Cannes

Born in Cannes in 1990, Victor Dubuisson made a mark on French golf from the very start.

World No. 1 amateur in 2009, he turned professional in 2010 and quickly made his presence felt on the European Tour, winning the prestigious Turkish Airlines Open in 2013. He thus became the highest-ranked French player in history, reaching 17th in the world rankings.

Trained on the sun-drenched greens of Biot, Châteauneuf-Grasse, and Opio, Dubuisson made headlines at the 2014 World Match Play Championship, narrowly losing in the final to Jason Day. This performance earned him a spot on the Ryder Cup team, and he helped win the tournament that same year, becoming only the second Frenchman to achieve this distinction.

His career also includes two European Tour victories, including a second Turkish Airlines Open in 2015, along with multiple Top 10 finishes. In 2017, Dubuisson returned to the World Golf Ranking Top 100, climbing to 99th place. He retired from professional golf in 2023 and today serves as an ambassador for Old Course Cannes-Mandelieu.

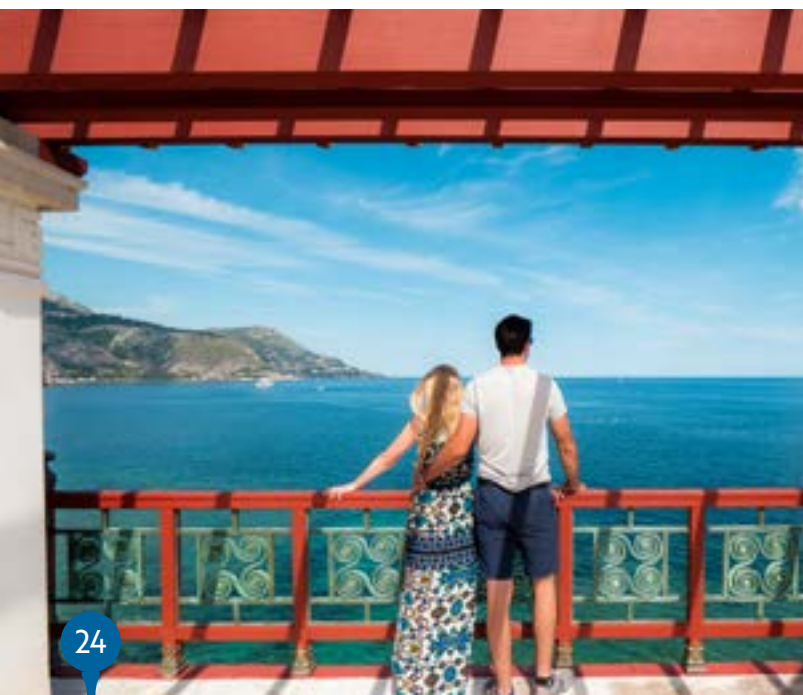

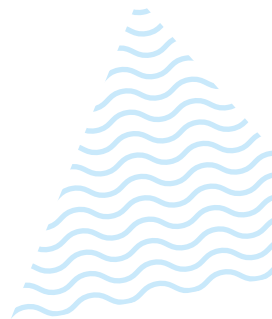
